This past year has given many of us the opportunity to go deeper, below the surface, in our thinking as Covid brought a corporate experience to a variety of emotions. One fruit of the Spirit that I have come to better understand is joy. James writes in James 1:2–4, "Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, so that you may be perfect (mature) and complete, lacking in nothing."

I am not sure why I have struggled to define joy. One possibility is that I have not had multiple experiences with trials. My life, to this point, has had fewer trials than many of my brothers and sisters in Christ around the world. I am blessed in so many ways. While it is true I have had some deeps hurts and experiences, comparatively speaking, life has been good. Better than good. However, for me, this past year has been hard. On occasion, I have felt the struggle of trials. These trials have been birthed by both reality and imagination. Regardless, James has encouraged me to "keep the faith" and endure.

As a church we have experienced trials. We have been called to endurance. We have been given the invitation to "count it all joy". Sunday School classes have had to adjust; camps and outreach events have been cancelled. Baptisms have decreased; attendance has decreased; deaths have increased. Our choir loft has been empty.

So, what is joy? Joy is celebrating the presence of Jesus. I have endured because the reality of His presence with me has reminded me that I am not alone. I do not have to face challenges in my own strength. I can take courage and embrace hope because He has promised to never leave me, nor forsake me. I can endure because He keeps His promises. I can endure because God does not waste experiences. Life challenges, when met with joy, can result in a mature believer: a believer who trusts God with life circumstances. May we always trust God, knowing He always wants what is best for us.

May the joy of the Lord be our strength! Celebrate the presence of the Lord!
