



# NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

This coming July, I will have spent 10 years in community with First Baptist Church. These 10 years have been a time of joy and pressure: joy in realizing that Christ has been with us on the journey, pressure in that anytime a person, a group, an entity is seeking to please God, there will be spiritual tension, unease, or downright warfare. The joy has been a gift from God through His Spirit. Most of the pressure has been self-inflicted. There have been times when I confused pleasing God with pleasing people. Knowing so many of you upon my arrival, my fear was that I would disappoint.

The crucible of church leadership has a way of bringing to the surface the strengths and weaknesses of leadership. There are two prayers that have found their way to my heart. The first is, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me, Your Beloved." The second is, "I can do all things through Him who gives me strength."

I have spent a great deal of my life with a longing to know God and love God, praying that others might do the same. I have been fortunate to be occupationally involved in such a way to do this more easily than some. There has been an ebb and flow of arranging my life for spiritual seeking. However, Sabbath on my part has been neglected. These COVID days were sustainable by "Be still and know that I am God." There have been days I felt as if treading water described the journey. I neglected rest. Sabbath.

I have been challenged by my desire. Do I desire His presence or His activity? Do I desire His blessing, my comfort, or my "success"?

My definition of "success" regarding the harmony of "pastoring" and "living" has been illusive at times. Being a pastor has proven to be what I sensed it to be: hard. I am so grateful for the prayers of Boyd Smith, who weekly in the back hallway would lift me up into the grace of God. Many of you have prayed for me. Thank you.

I am so grateful to have journeyed these years with you. And I am so grateful the staff that serves you has been such a beautiful source of encouragement to me. I cannot imagine doing this alone. Jesus chose a small community to be with Him. He then passed the baton of ministry to these disciples who did likewise to the next generation. This assuming the "gospel responsibility" was not easy and it took great discipline: discipline that needs to be nurtured in the context of community.

Community is not easy. We are so "busy", occupied by things that compete for our attention, our very souls. Don't be fooled. We need each other. I am grateful. I am grateful God designed it that way.

# NOTES FROM KIDS1ST MINISTRY

In Kids1st we want to focus on what really matters and teach with the end in mind. What is the end or purpose? It is to create strong children of faith who become lifelong disciples! What is a disciple? A disciple is someone who is following Jesus, being changed by Jesus, and is committed to the mission of Jesus. How do we do this? We do this by intentionally cultivating our Sunday school hour to center around God's Word in fun, age appropriate ways! Did you know that the single greatest thing you can do for a child to point them toward a lifelong faith in Jesus is to create a love of Bible reading? Statistically, reading the Bible is the single greatest influencer on a child's faith.

How do we do this in Sunday School? Our Sunday School morning is divided up into three sections. Each week, our kids have a rotation where they participate in each activity.

We have our Gospel Project section where kids read the Bible and study the Bible chronologically through a gospel lens. We are currently in the book of Numbers and every three years we make it systematically through the whole Bible.

Next, is our Bible literacy section where kids are learning about God's Word, learning the books of the Bible, how to find Scripture passages, the different literary genres and how they are read, and the 99 essential doctrines of our faith.

Lastly, we have our prayer and connection section where kids get to spin the wheel of prayer and spend time strategically learning to pray while praying for missionaries, friends, family, and neighbors. During this time they get to build community with each other and establish friendships.


