



NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

FBC Family,

These have been interesting days in the life of our church. Obviously, I will soon be passing the torch as your pastor to someone the Lord will send our way to lead us as a church. Significant decisions will be made and your prayers are so important. We all need to commit to praying for our Pastor Search Committee.

This is a most important time in the history of FBC. COVID has presented us with a new dynamic regarding onsite or online attendance. We have had right at 50 of our precious members leave this earth since the beginning of this pandemic. Sunday morning Bible Study is low in attendance, as well as our worship gatherings. This is a national occurrence in the life of the vast majority of churches.

I am grateful for a staff that lives and serves together in harmony. The challenge of making decisions each week has brought us together for encouragement and prayer. It can be discouraging at times.

As you would expect with First Baptist, there are things to be celebrated. Our Men's Ministry and our Women's Ministry are nurturing an environment of discipleship and fellowship, encouraging one another to grow in the grace of God. Small groups and large groups are meeting on Wednesday nights and throughout the week. We are seeing our children respond to the Gospel and declare salvation through baptism. And faithful servants continue to minister to our international students.

As I would expect, the tornado tragedy brought out the best of FBC. Close to \$100,000 has been given to our tornado mission relief fund. About a third of this amount came from our members; a third from outside donors; and a third from a church who observed our efforts with the disaster relief and wanted to commend and support our efforts. We are working with strategic partners to meet the continuous needs of those affected by this tragedy.

Our Family Life Center was turned into a strategic headquarters for our Kentucky Baptist Disaster Relief Teams and other disaster relief entities utilized our church facilities. It is estimated that over 200 folks used our church as a home base for ministry during the month of December. In addition to these 200, many FBC members made trips to Mayfield and other areas to help. First Baptist was asked by the management of Kenlake State Park to take the leadership role in helping displaced families and individuals housed there at our state park. The response was incredible! Meals were provided and other needs met. I am so grateful we were able to utilize the FLC in this effort and further grateful that the debt on our building will be completely paid off when we have \$87,000 more in giving.

Our World Mission Offering goal was exceeded with over \$177,000 given for missions: just amazing! In addition, over \$20,000 from our Benevolent Fund has been given to meet practical needs of families in the area, from rent and utility payments to food and clothing; the funds were distributed through the local school systems.

I am further pleased to share that while we were at \$32,000 in the red budget-wise, we finished \$59,123.82 in the black with giving versus actual expenditures!

We have some challenges and opportunities. We continue to seek wisdom. May grace, peace, and love

I also want to encourage you to get involved in MidWeek programming at FBC. Fellowship Supper begins at 5:00 pm and our Men's Ministry, Women's Bible Studies, and COED prayer group begin at 6:00 pm. Getting involved in MidWeek is a great way to connect and grow with the body of Christ.

It has been so awesome to see how God has used you, FBC Murray, to step up and serve over the past couple of months. So many individuals and families have been looking for hope. In addition to giving upwards of \$100,000 for the Disaster Relief Fund, we have seen the bride of Christ exceed the World Mission Offering goal by several thousand dollars. Even more, there were a countless number of church members who served in Mayfield, Marshall County, KenLake, and right here...as we lodged upwards of 200 different people over a three-week period in our Family Life Center. Because of so many who faithfully pledged and gave, the Family Life Center is very close to being completely paid off. Thank God for His provision and faithfulness!

As we thank God for what He has done...we must also trust God for what He will do!

Church leaders and staff at FBC Murray are praying and thinking about what needs to be done to upgrade the first and second floor of Kid's First and the children's playground area to provide an incredible environment where kids will come to know and follow the Lord. God has graciously and generously given us the resources we need to invest in the future of FBC Murray. We can only hope the future of our church shines even brighter than the past. Please be in prayer as we continue to move forward for His glory! More to come...





MEET THE CHURCH MEMBERS Warren and Laurie Edminster



I am a professor and administrator at Murray State. My wife, Laurie, teaches at Murray High School. We have 3 daughters, 1 son-in-law, and 1 granddaughter.

Laurie and I joined FBC in 2000, shortly after we moved to Murray. I serve on the Missions Ministry Team and participate in the men's ministry. Laurie sings on the worship team. My family has been very involved with the mission trips to Zimbabwe. We took a group to help with renovating a Baptist Hospital in Zimbabwe in 2011. A lot of college students signed up, so the Baptist Convention of Zimbabwe (BCZ) asked if we would host a college student retreat as part of our trip, which we did. Zimbabwean students helped with the renovation during the day, and we had Bible studies and worship services in the morning and at night. During that retreat, it became evident that there was a great need for young adult discipleship, and the BCZ asked if we would consider coming back. After much prayer, we returned the following year and then five more times, usually every other year. Each time we would hold 2 young adult retreats at various locations around Zimbabwe. BCM and FBC College students participated in each trip, emphasizing Bible study and the building of discipleship groups. From the first trip, Willie Banda, a young Zimbabwean pastor with a heart for youth, helped us with trip logistics and traveled with us. In between FBC trips, Pastor Banda continues to work with different groups of Christian young adults around the country. We have not been able to travel to Zimbabwe since the pandemic

Currently, my favorite passages of scripture are Philippians 1:6, "I am sure of this, that He who started a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." and Ephesians 2:10, "For we are His creation, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared ahead of time so that we should walk in them." -Warren
