NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

Who would have thought last March that the intensity of COVID-19 would be waiting for us as we enter the holiday season? Yet, here we are, engulfed in uncertainty, which has made our sermon series in the book of Samuel all the more timely. David is at a discouraging time in his life where he needs a true friend. His life is full of tough times. He is isolated from his family, his friends, and waiting for the fulfillment of his anointing as king by Samuel upon his life. As we watch the story of David unfold, we see his disappointment and even more than one brush with death! Here is a young giant killer, with thousands of fans, wondering what went wrong. As David pushes through his fatigue, frustration, failure, and fears, little did he know that God was behind it all preparing him to be king. It turned out to be a lonely road.

For some of us, these themes are all too real in the days of COVID. Frustrations, discouragement, and the need for friendship are front and center. We have been addressing these life experiences currently in our time together on Sunday morning. This past Sunday, we looked at loneliness. Life may seem to be in "lockdown," but that doesn't mean we have to be disconnected, out of touch, and anxious. God is inviting us to experience Him. Philippians 4:6-7 says "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

We have four new deacons who will be serving us for the next three years beginning in January: Emmanuel Apeh, Clegg Austin, Al Chapman, and Mike Lovins. Their ordination will be adjusted to fit the challenges of COVID. These will be joined by four deacons who have previously served: Marty Davenport, David Parker, Fred Stalls, and Jeff Stewart.

We are going into a season where needs can be overwhelming and magnified. I am so grateful for the generosity of our church family. Your benevolence offerings and mission giving are making it possible to encourage people during some challenging times. Some of these include: Tiger Christmas - \$3,000; Laker Christmas - \$4,000; Hope Calloway (formerly The Gentry House and Murray Calloway County Homeless Coalition) - \$3,000; Needline - \$1,000. In addition, various families have been assisted with various needs. This giving is in addition to the ministries we support through our World Mission Offering.

We expect many needs to emerge during these upcoming winter months. Your giving is now giving hope to people who need to know they are not forgotten. I am so grateful for the ministries with whom we partner. As we look to the immediate near future, I hope you will join me in giving to our FBC budget, World Mission Offering, and our Family Life Center. May the peace and grace of Jesus flow to you and through you during these days.

On Sunday, November 29, and Sunday, December 6, we will not have in-person worship services. Instead, we will have online worship services broadcast on our FBC Facebook and YouTube pages at 11:00 am. Guest speakers Jeff Palmer and Terry Ellis will bring powerful messages during these online worship services. With the exception of the church business meeting scheduled for Sunday, December 6 at 5:30 pm in the Sanctuary, there will be no on-campus activities on these two Sundays. There will be extra precautions taken to practice social distancing during the business meeting.

We plan to resume in-person and online combined worship services from December 13-January 10 at 11:00 am. There will be no 8:30 am worship service during this time. We will also resume on-campus Sunday School (for classes that have chosen to meet in-person) and Kids1st Worship on December 13. Many classes continue to connect and meet on Zoom. We encourage you to reach out to your Sunday School class or contact the church office for more information on Sunday School class locations and meeting times.

During this season of uncertainty, we are doing all we can to plan and adjust by being sensitive to the needs and health of our families while continuing to advance the gospel. We have so much to be thankful for especially knowing that God sent us his son Emmanuel. He has all authority in heaven and on earth, and He promised to be with us, always!




