Reciting "all" of God's wonderful works eliminates the need to classify blessings according to size or significance. . . we enjoy all as glad recipients of a generous Father.

Please spend some time taking inventory of all God's "wonderful deeds" this season. Reflect, pray, and share them with others. Do it with all of them. . . big and small, clear and unseen, pleasurable and difficult. You never know. . . the Lord might have a purpose beyond your experience of that special mercy—He might want to use your story of His faithfulness to draw others to Himself; to restore hope to someone broken; or to encourage perseverance in a friend.

You are one of the Lord's most recent, vivid, and gracious blessings to me. I love you, even more than pretty leaves.


