



NOTES FROM THE SENIOR PASTOR

A New Year—for many—presents opportunity for all sorts of fresh starts. Many of you, in the opening days of the calendar year, will develop personal habits designed to add clarity, health, growth, and purpose to your lives. This is a good thing to do from time-to-time: of all people, God's people should examine themselves in light of God's purposes, revealed in Christ and empowered by the Spirit.

Some of you will begin to do things this month that you have not yet done—or do them a different way—in order to enjoy something you have yet to obtain or become what you have yet to be. You have in mind a preferred future that requires adjustment, and whether or not you get there hinges upon the decision to either wish for it or work for it. That "preferred future" is known by many names: Target. Goal. Outcome. Vision. A vision, in order to motivate consistent action, must be clear and compelling. What isn't clear confuses, scatters, and frustrates; what doesn't compel encourages disinterest. Many good habits get dropped for lack of clear vision, and many clear visions are forgotten for lack of concerted, undistracted effort.

Establish the vision. Create the path. Do the next thing. Trust the process. Repeat.

We are living—together— in a season of transition. . . but the Lord has not left us guessing about the clear and compelling future toward which He is working all things. If our paths are scattered or steps erratic, it isn't for lack of direction. The task before us is the same as for every other generation of Christians and churches: to understand the will of the Lord and order our steps according to His way, expecting His Presence to guide us and Spirit to enable us. We cannot simply wish for progress. . . we must work for it. Listen. Adjust. Persevere. Trust. Act.

What would the Lord have you to be and do this year that will only be made possible by His wisdom and strength? What would the Lord have us to be and do in the days ahead that only He can accomplish? There are opportunities afforded to all Christians and churches everywhere throughout all time. But what—specifically—about you? About us?

These are the questions I'm asking right now, for myself and for us; I hope that you are as well. We do not know what the next day holds, let alone the next year. But we do know that our God is faithful (1 Thess. 5:23–24), His authority unrivaled (Eph. 1:21–23), and His promises sure (1 Pet. 1:3–4). He will be magnified in our joys and sorrows, strengths and weaknesses, highs and lows.

It brings me inexpressible joy to wish you a Happy New Year. Our family is grateful to be part of the First Baptist family. I am praying for you—and for us—as we begin this year together. We have a lot to talk about, pray for, and work toward. The Lord knows all of that and remains more ready to answer than we are to ask (Eph. 3:20).
