You never truly know what a new day may bring. For Western Kentucky, a new day brought devastation, loss of property, loss of life, and loss of hope. And then, another day brought the body of Christ rallying together to remind people that God cares, God loves, and God remembers. God does not just sit on the sideline as people experience suffering. No. He mobilizes the presence of Christ through the body of Christ.

Even those who have not experienced the redemption of grace know it was not intended to be this way. The power of sin does not care who we are nor where we are. The fallen order of creation can be quite chaotic. The wonder of creation, in all God's glory and majesty, a wonder that catches our breath and gives us pause to realize there must be a Creator, can often express a demonstration of destruction. Yes, even creation groans for the day when things will be "made right".

I am so grateful for First Baptist Murray, who in foresight believed that an investment made "now" could make a difference "when". Word went out. FBC Murray is ready to assist "now". Four different disaster relief entities (maybe more) found their way to our church – a place to set up their "command centers", to launch relief efforts to a hurting Western Kentucky. **Kentucky Baptist Convention Disaster Relief** teams were the first to arrive, filling up our parking lot with trailers of supplies and equipment and our Family Life Center with people eager to help in a practical way and to express the love of Jesus. **Waterstep**, a world-wide water purification enterprise arrived next, setting up a purification unit at the Mayfield Community Health Center and now as I write, another unit being placed at a fire station in Marshall County. **Send Relief**, the Disaster Relief expression of the **North American Mission Board**, has now arrived and has integrated their efforts with ours.

Because of our ability to offer use of our Family Life Center, FBC Murray has become a central hub and distribution center of hope expressed to people in Graves, Marshall, Trigg, and Calloway counties, Dawson Springs, Princeton and who knows where! This morning, members of the FBC Murray family packed up and headed out to destinations that needed an expression of hope: 170 people touched at Kenlake State Park, in addition to others, receiving the message that they are not alone.

Behind the scenes, and vitally important, are Christ followers preparing thousands of meals, cleaning portable shower units, leading chain-saw teams, providing clothes for children, gift cards for the cashless, hugging those who hurt, and praying for those in pain. The Anchor holds.

Much of what is taking place right now is supported by our World Mission Offering. The Church is the hope of the world. I give to our church because I believe that Jesus plus nothing equals everything. When we give, we are strengthening the platform to present the Gospel. Some of those platform expressions are FBC Mayfield and FBC Benton. The churches in Mayfield are devasted structurally but their platform for the Gospel is sure: the light of the world! FBC Benton, our sister church where Jeremy Hudgin serves as pastor, is on the front lines ministering to people who have lost so much.

I am giving more this year because I believe it is what Jesus desires of me. I will give more to our **budget**, for it is the foundational support of the everyday efforts of what we do as FBC Murray. I will give more to the **World Mission Offering** because it touches people here and around the world with the Gospel. I will give to the **Family Life Center**, which for now and decades to come, will serve as a platform to support the Gospel dreams of this church long after I am gone. I will give because the Anchor holds.

As a church, let's commit to serving our neighbors and each other with compassion, patience, and grace. We need each other to stand strong and serve well.



Great news! We now have non-fiction books available on our e-book and audio book online system. To access the online system follow these steps:

Go to fbcmurray.org/library and click the online catalog link.

- 2. Login with your library card ID (call or stop by the library if you don't know your number or need to apply for a library card). You will need to put fbc in front of the number and then add enough zeroes in front of the number to make it 8 digits. For example: if your library card number is 534 your login would be fbc00000534.
- 3. Add your name
- Add your email address
- Click register

You will then be able to enjoy our online e-books and audio books. The system allows checkout for two weeks and then the book is checked back in automatically. If you are not finished, re-check the book for an additional 2 weeks. The Axis 360 app is available on Apple and Android.
