



## NOTES FROM THE TRANSITIONAL PASTOR RUSTY ELLISON

#### Church family,

Fall is here and it is a beautiful time of year around Murray. And, as well, it is a very exciting time in the life of our church. As we wrap up *Experiencing God* together, the timing is of God as our search team continues to seek God's will regarding the coming of our next pastor. The first tenet, as most all of us should know by now, asserts that God is always at work around us.

We are witnessing God at work week after week. As a transitional pastor, I sometimes find myself serving a church in which it is a rather uneventful time in the life of a church, the "in between" period between the "old" pastor and the "new." This has not been the case here at Murray. Most every week since we began together at Easter, we've seen the evidence of God at work.

We have heard the testimonies of those who have come for baptism and celebrated how God is at work in their lives! Professions of faith and baptism, of course, are an integral part of why we do what we do as a church, declaring the Gospel to all who will hear!

The last three weeks, now that camp is over, I have been to Eastern Kentucky visiting with ministry partners and delivering both funds and much-needed supplies. Words do not adequately express what I have seen and heard on my visits. The devastation is just hard to imagine. I've talked with some who lost everything they own. I heard two stories of those who survived the night of the flood by climbing to the top of trees in order to stay above the raging water. I've heard the stories of the cries for help that night, before helicopters came to airlift them to safety. I've encouraged and loved on a pastor who had the funeral for four kids from one family who lost their lives that night. I could go on and on, but, it will be years before things approach normalcy in little towns like Hindman, Dwarf, and Emmalena.

In the midst of the pain, suffering and loss of life, we see God at work through the church as the resilient people of Eastern Kentucky love and encourage each other. We see God at work as 17 Baptist State Conventions send disaster relief (DR) teams spread out over the area for the long to be endured task of cleaning up, in the meantime serving tens of thousands of meals to those who are hungry. Our own Ken and Jill Asher are in Whitesburg as I write this, working with fellow Kentuckians with our DR folks there. Whitesburg is one of the hardest hit communities in the entire area.

When the next opportunity comes, let me urge all of you who are able to take advantage of training offered by Ron Crow and his team in order to be ready to answer the call when the next disaster comes.

All of us can agree that these disasters are coming with increasing frequency. In conclusion, I remain very thankful that I have had the opportunity to serve you all during this season of transition. Your search team is the finest with whom I have ever worked! Continue to pray that God will give them necessary wisdom as they diligently seek His will in the search. I'm excited to see what God does in the process in the coming weeks.

God is always at work around us. Even in times when we do not have a "permanent" pastor. If you don't see how God is working, it's because you're not looking! How this has been true at First Baptist Murray! It is my privilege to serve with you as we go through this time together!

I hope to see you Sunday with a Bible in your hand and the love of Christ in your heart.

## NOTES FROM KIDS1ST MINISTRY RACHEL RIQUELME

JURRAY KY

It is a new school year and the beginning to another great year in Kids1st. We have new families participating, kids moving up to the second floor, and kids diving deeper in their journey of discipleship, so here is some information about what we are doing and the why behind it.

As you may know, during Sunday School, preschool classes, and in Kids1st Worship we use the Gospel Project. This allows what we learn in Sunday School, preschool classes, and Kids1st Worship to build on each other to deepen your child's understanding. We go through scripture chronologically and take three years to go through the whole Bible. We are in 1 Kings now.

During Sunday School, our approach to learning on the second floor is through rotations. Children learn the Bible Story focus in one rotation. In this rotation they read their Bibles, learn from the Gospel Project lesson, and get to see how Christ is at the center of everything in scripture. During the second rotation, your children learn Bible literacy skills. They learn how to find chapters and verses in scripture, what genres are in the Bible and how to read them, and they memorize scripture and the books of the Bible. Then they have their prayer and fellowship rotation where they get to spin the wheel of prayer, pray for someone on the list, learn about how and why we pray, and connect with their peers to build lasting relationships.

During Kids1st Worship, your child learns the Bible story content on a deeper level, engages in worship with scripture based songs, and participates in activities that drive home what they are learning based on where we are in scripture, our Christ connection, and the 99 essential doctrines of our faith.

Beginning this semester on Wednesday evenings in MidWeek, we are going through the Bible book by book starting with Genesis. In large group, children are learning how to study God's word using the **OIA** approach. We are learning how to **observe** scripture, **interpret** scripture, and **apply** scripture with a gospel lens. In small group, your children are interacting with scripture, having time to reflect on what they read, and use the principles they learned in small group. Then they finish up the evening being engaged in activities that drive home what they learned from scripture.

Exciting things are happening in the Kids1st Ministry and we are so grateful your family is a part of it!



We kick off the World Mission Offering on Sunday, September 25! Our kids are singing in the 10:30 am worship service. We are singing Revelation 7:9 from Seeds Family Worship.



Have you checked out the Parent Hub outside the library? We have curated books for the ages and stages of your children along with resources about our MidWeek Bible content, Sunday morning content, TAWGS, and our Kids1st Scope and Sequence which shows where we will be in scripture for the year.



Parents, are you looking for a way to help your child read God's Word daily? Use our September TAWG (Time Alone with God) sheet to help your child get into the routine of reading scripture daily. Kids will read a few verses in the book of John each day to follow along with the guide.
