NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

It was so good to see 175 of us gathered this past Sunday, Father's Day, to experience corporate worship in our FBC Sanctuary. This is certainly down from our average of "615ish" the first ten Sundays of the year. In the summer months, we usually run 475-500 total attendees. However, these are different times and it is understood why many will remain home. I support your decision, knowing we will see each other again.

Speaking of seeing each other, it is truly amazing to think many of us are going MONTHS without actually SEEING one another. And, even as we gathered, masks prevented us from seeing the beautiful faces of our brothers and sisters in Christ. I sure look forward to the end of COVID-19! However, in the meantime, I encourage you to connect with someone. We all need a touch!

Briefly, as a reminder, allow me to share the precautions we took this past Sunday: everyone that arrived received a temperature check at the door, a mask was provided, social distancing was encouraged in the Welcome Center, seating in the Sanctuary was arranged for adequate separation, collection of the offering was at the door (no passing of the plate), and all surfaces were sanitized before and after the services (using a combination of a mist machine and sanitizer wipes). Please know we are seeking to provide the safest atmosphere possible. When the day comes and overflow space is needed, we will use the Family Life Center.

Our church calendar has undergone massive change: cancellations, postponements, and adjustments. We still face some major challenges regarding preparation for Mother's Day Out and the timing of the return for Sunday School and MidWeek. On the MDO side, our leadership is going the extra mile to meet the state requirements. On the Sunday School/Bible Study small group side, we are keeping in consideration the lead of our local schools and health authorities.

This coming Sunday, June 28, Jason Ellerbrook will be with us in view of a call to serve as our executive pastor.
